"IT'S NOT EASY, BUT IT'S SIMPLE"

This past weekend, we had the privilege of thanking our ministry volunteers. We came together to view the movie, "God's Not Dead: Light in the Darkness." It was a fun evening together and a good movie. Since viewing the film, I can't get one line out of my head. Here it is: "It's not easy, but it's simple." This line was said in reference to the calling of ministry on a public university's campus. I can't help but think the application of this line far extends the boundaries of public universities to the life of every Christian, and I dare say, every human.

Think about employment. What do you have to do in order to maintain employment? Show up and work hard. Is it easy? No, but it's simple.

Now that it's spring, like many of you, I'm thinking about a garden. Is growing your own fruits and vegetables easy? No, but it's simple. Give the plant what

it needs and keep threats from it.

Want to become healthier? Follow your doctor's recommended nutrition and exercise program. It's not easy (just ask Pastor Shawn about the time he drank decaf), but it's simple.

This movie quote transcends culture and race and is at the heart of the Christian faith. Jesus boils everything down in His response to the lawyer who asks about the greatest commandment. He replied, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind." He goes on to say, "The second is like it: You shall love your neighbor as yourself. On these two commandments depend all the Law and the Prophets." The Christian life is simple: Love God and love others; it's just not easy.

Instead of keeping it simple, we unnecessarily complicate it. Our love

of God becomes checklists of dos and don'ts. We judge ourselves on how we are doing, believing we are responsible for our own salvation. Faith in Jesus alone, by the Holy Spirit's work in our lives, is the only way to salvation. Let's not complicate it. Keep it simple. Love God for Who He is and what He does. What does that look like? It's a relationship, not a transaction. Spend time with God, reading His Word, following His instruction, talking with Him, singing, journaling, being in creation, etc. You do these things to get to know God, not to get things from God.

The same is true for our love of others. Often we love them transactionally or conditionally. They must meet a certain criteria prior to our full embrace. That's not the love Jesus displayed. He died for us while we were still sinners. I realize loving people the way they are, where they are, isn't easy, but it's simple.

I heard a beautiful sound coming from the Carpentry Level Two classroom as I walked outside the vocational training building last week. It was the sound of power tools. As a carpenter myself, naturally this is a sweet sound to me. But there are two reasons this struck me the way it did. The first is because after 2½ years of waiting, these machines can now operate by direct access to a power supply. The second is that this is the first time these students have had the opportunity to use equipment like this. They were all trained to use hand tools in Carpentry Level One, but they now have the chance to expand their skills by returning for Level Two. I am impressed by the quality of projects that are being produced by the class, and "There is Hope" will be promoting their work as time goes on.

Pictured is Aubrey Banda, a Malawian who graduated at the top of "There Is Hope's" first Carpentry Level One class and quickly started his own shop. I was thrilled to see him return this year for Level Two. His desire to learn will take him far in a place of limited opportunities.

NATIONAL DAY OF PRAYER

Thursday, May 3, is National Day of Prayer. On April 17, 1952, President Truman declared the first National Day of Prayer in the U.S. In 1988, President Reagan amended Truman's declaration—establishing the first Thursday of every May as our nation's day of prayer. This year, under the leadership of Char Wabeke, Gwen Snoeyink, and Pastor Mike, Fellowship will be hosting or participating in several prayer events. Prayer guides have been placed in everyone's mailbox for personal use or as an outline to follow for a family prayer session. A sign-up sheet has been made available in the lobby where individuals or families can commit to prayer in designated 30-minute segments. Fellowship members are also encouraged to join others from the community at the Hudsonville City Monument Park (next to City Hall) at either 8:00am or noon for a time of prayer. Public prayer is a right and a privilege guaranteed to all Americans by our Constitution. As Christians, we are called to remember, appreciate, and take advantage of God's amazing gift of an intimate relationship with the Creator Himself through prayer.



REVELATION "GOD WINS"

Pre-millennialists adhere to the beliefs of an earthly millennial reign of Christ as well as a rapture of the faithful coming before (dispensational) or after (historic) the Great Tribulation preceding the Millennium.

A-millennialists believe the term millennium to be a symbolic reference to the entire New Testament era.


NEW CITY CATECHISM


