## "FAITHFUL TOGETHER"

The expression on the doctor's face speaks for itself; her words verify the diagnosis: your time is limited—short at best. If you have something important to do, to say, or to see, do it soon. Very soon.

Christ knew His time was short at best, too. In a matter of days, He would celebrate Passover with His disciples—confusing their understanding of the meal as He presented Himself as the true Passover Lamb. His crucifixion and death would soon follow.

But before ascending the steps to the upper room, Christ made the most of His time—sharing three important stories with His disciples. This trio in Matthew 25 pointedly describes the life of a faithful disciple—one who lives in great anticipation of Christ's return—while diligently serving every day in the name of Christ to meet the spiritual and physical needs of those around them.

Story number one: a tale of ten bridesmaids. As was the tradition, they were waiting for the groom to arrive. Five were prepared with fueled-lanterns in case it got late. The other five had lanterns, too—but not enough fuel. When the groom arrived, only the fueled-five were ready. "Watch therefore, for you know neither the day nor the hour" (Matthew 25:13).

Story number two: three servants. As the master prepares for a trip, he distributes his property between his three servants. He desires that they use it well and profitably for him. Two invest and serve him wisely. One buries it in the ground—doing nothing. "You wicked and slothful servant" (Matthew 25:26). Ouch!

Story number three: seeing the need. Jesus is speaking about His return as King of kings. He notes that faithful disciples will be those who recognized and addressed the immediate needs

of those around them—in His name. Those who were hungry, thirsty, alone, naked, sick, or imprisoned. "Truly, I say to you, as you did it to one of the least of these my brothers, you did it to Me" (Matthew 25:40).

The lesson? Number one: do not let time get away from you. Do not waste a single moment. Jesus will return—and we need to be prepared for His arrival. Number two: you have been given incredible gifts—gifts to be used for the glory of God and the blessing of others; don't bury them in your busyness. Number three: you are surrounded every day by lives that matter to God—broken, hurting, and lost. As His disciples, reach out with love and empathy.

Let's be faithful together—growing in our faith while intentionally blessing the community in which we've been planted to serve.

### HOPE FOOTBALL GAME—FOR FREE









### LOOKING AHEAD


